


Partners-in-Education (PiE)




Adopt-a-School

Under this program, entities (Schools, NGOs, corporates etc.) can adopt an underprivileged school for a duration of one year, and can provide them help in the following ways:

- Conduct at least 3 events for children during the year.
 This can include events like competitions, activities, school visits etc.
- Conduct at least 3 teacher events during the year. This can include teacher training sessions, teacher interactions etc.
- Make at least one donation of stationary, equipment, etc.,
 during the year

Under this program, entities (Schools, NGOs, corporates, individuals etc.) can sign up for helping an underprivileged school via events and interactions — as and when desired. Help can be provided in any form, such as:

- Donations of supplies (books, notebooks, stationery, uniform etc.)
- Volunteering
- Mentoring sessions
- After-school tutoring etc.
